MISSION STATEMENT

To support marginalised people 14+ with an average IQ with Autism, ADHD, Dyspraxia, Tourette's Syndrome, mostly with mental ill health and their carers to find a sustainable lifestyle.

Summary of what we do

We help people 14+ and their families access our invaluable service to stop isolation, feel more confident when dealing with other agencies such as the NHS, Job Centre DWP. We support the whole family to improve wellbeing.

Our friendly and caring team are dedicated in providing a warm and welcoming service to all our clients and carers. Catering for people with an average or above average

IQ on the Autistic Spectrum and people who think they are on the spectrum but do not yet have a diagnosis.

We understand from our own experiences knowledge and professional training that being on the Autistic Spectrum has many challenges.

If you describe yourself as being lonely or different, that people misunderstand you or you feel like you have never quite 'slotted' into society, why not have a chat with our team.



LIFEWORKS SERVICES

Lifeworks have a variety of social activities and support groups in our office for people on the autistic spectrum to meet likeminded people. Our clients can find it difficult to socialise and we provide a safe welcoming environment where clients can talk to each other and join in any activities to

improve confidence and well-being. For more information about our groups please see our website or activities/events calendar. (During Covid we are using Zoom for on line groups). If you need to see someone in private to discuss personal issues or struggle in group environments please contact

Lifeworks and we can arrange a one to one appointment for you to see one of our professionals. At this appointment you will be able to discuss a variety of issues and we can refer you for a formal diagnosis if you do not have one already. (During Covid this would be by telephone)

Our Outcomes tackle areas that are not currently commissioned by the NHS—we offer Value for Money, and Savings for Statutory Services.

We help carers emotional wellbeing from peer support. Signpost to Carer Services such as North Staffs Carers or the Carers Hub to access Carer Assessments.

Families/carers - we take some pressure off and help them to feel more confident in dealing with the NHS or JCP— with emotional support to help their wellbeing.

Lifeworks Staffordshire is a charity supporting people on the autistic spectrum, founded in 2006 by Louise Zandian, who is now our CEO. The charity goes from strength to strength, supporting approximately 600 individuals and their families. In 2013, we received the Queens Award for Voluntary Services. Lifeworks is a Disability Confident.

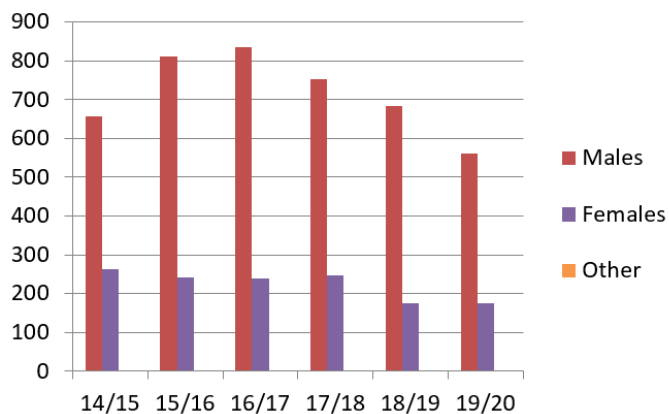

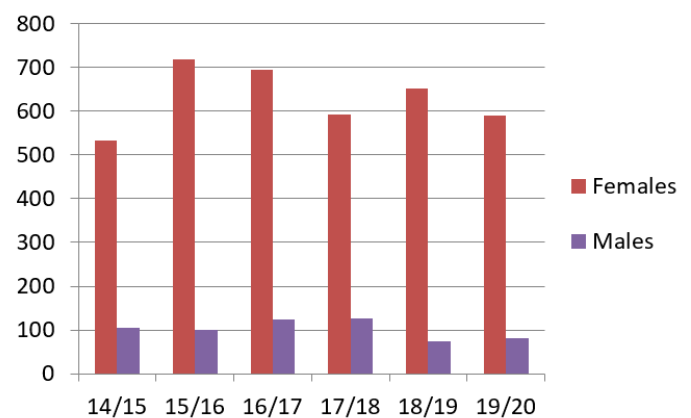

Since becoming a client in 2013 I have more self-confidence and this has boosted my self-esteem.

I feel understood at Lifeworks and this has helped remove the isolation I was experiencing'.

They have supported me with housing and work related issues, getting my PIP, as well as encouraging me with my studies and voluntary work within Lifeworks.

20/07/19 Fantastic organisation providing tailored individual support and advice to individuals and families.

25/10/19 The DWP sent me a letter today to confirm that they will continue to pay me ESA so thank you for your hard work to support me. The extra funds have made a vast difference and I have been able to buy a weighted blanket and this has helped me sleep better.

4/10/19 Call from dad thanking us for help with getting his son into the ESA support group we couldn't have done it without Joan's help.

Since lockdown we have received funding to support our clients and carer's remotely via zoom.

Janet does a weekly group, of either a client chat, a quiz or bingo supported by volunteers. Sue does a weekly carer chat and although this is not the same as face to face meetings it is a way to help our clients and carers from being socially isolated. We also support people by telephone calls, texts and emails.

Lifeworks have been a lifeline to me as a parent and to my son as an advocate & social interpreter. Support at benefit assessments, including providing documentary evidence. Help with other professionals. Lifeworks has the knowledge and experience and is able to work with families and the people it supports individually in a way that large national charities can't. As an older parent I need the reassurance that the charity will be there for my son in the future when I am not or am unable to provide support in old age. They have always been there at the end of the phone.

My son has Aspergers, and had been assessed as **no longer eligible for ESA**. We appealed it, but were very worried about the outcome.

Lifeworks provided a letter explaining how his disability affected him in his personal and work life, which we submitted to the judge beforehand. When we went in he said the appeal hearing was a formality as he had already decided based on my son's assessment report and the letter to grant the appeal. We are very grateful for your help.
